Creating Your Title

In the next three topics, you'll be using **WordArt** to create a main title for your **masthead**. WordArt is a graphic text object that you can use for logos, graphics, and other decorative headings.

You may be familiar with WordArt from other Microsoft programs, such as Microsoft Publisher. If so, you'll notice that Word 2007 also provides a **gallery** of predesigned WordArt graphics that you can select from.

To create your title

1. On the **Insert** tab, in the **Text** group, click **WordArt**. Then click **WordArt style 4**. The **Edit WordArt Text** box will appear.

2. In the **Text** box, select **Your Text Here**, and then type **SYCAMORE** in all caps.

3. In the **Font** list, click **Franklin Gothic Heavy**. In the **Size** list, click **24**. Then, click **OK**.

Note

You may need to edit WordArt text later. If so, on the **Format** tab, in the **Text** group click **Edit Text**.

4. On the **Insert** tab, in the **Text** group, click **WordArt**. Then, click **WordArt style 4**.

5. Click the **Text:** box. Use either the DELETE or BACKSPACE keys to remove **Your Text Here**. Type **SENTINEL** in all caps.

6. In the **Font** list, click **Franklin Gothic Book**. In the **Size** list, click **24**. Then, click **OK**. Your title will look like this:

SYCAMORESENTINEL
